The Partnership

McMahon Services has a long history working in and around Indigenous communities. Intract is a business formed through the partnership of The Aboriginal Foundation of South Australia and McMahon Services to provide contracting services to the mining and civil construction industries.

Intract has been developed to deliver long-term employment for Aboriginal people through the provision of stable jobs, skills training and on-the-job mentoring and support.

Training a “work ready” labour force

Intract boast a “work ready” labour force mentored by highly experienced personnel from McMahon Services. To further support training and development, the Intract Indigenous Employment Program was established, through funding from the Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations (DEEWR). A civil construction program was designed specifically for the initiative. Trainway were then engaged to coordinate a six week intensive program focusing on a selection of competency units from Certificate II in Civil Construction (RII20709).

Community Engagement / Employment

Intract are committed to employing local Aboriginal people from communities in which they work. Intract believe that is it important to engage local Aboriginal groups where we work to help close the gap and develop a close synergy between industry and local Aboriginal communities.

Training Partnership

In an arrangement with the Department for Planning, Transport & Infrastructure (DPTI), McMahon Services has developed a joint initiative with Carey Training, Complete Personnel and CITB to provide support for local Indigenous workers to complete Certificate I in Construction. McMahon Services not only provide assistance and mentoring, but also training and accommodation facilities.

Project Profile: Building in the APY Lands

Project Overview

McMahon Services was contracted by the South Australian Government to complete extensive refurbishment works of two Aboriginal Wellbeing Centres in Anangu communities in the State's APY Lands.

Working in both Amata and Pukatja, the projects called for structural construction works to carpentry, electrical, plumbing, concreting, roofing and cladding.

The projects also opened doors for Intract workers and local Anangu men living in the two towns and surrounding homelands. The Indigenous workers gained practical knowledge and on-the-job experience.

McMahon Services finished the remote works by constructing a new purpose-built shed to extend the Oodnadatta Aboriginal School's Tech Studies facility.
